 - use of "historical present" (tense)
 - vivid images and evocative sounds
- Apocalyptic drama with open ending
 - gospel originally ended at 16:8
- A strange motif: the "messianic secret"

Connecting the Author's Context to the Themes

Response to turmoil of mid-1st century

- Nero's persecution of Christians (64 CE)
- Jewish Revolt, destruction of Jerusalem (70 CE)
- · deaths of eyewitnesses Challenges of discipleship

- pressure under persecution
- internal tensions over leadership
- Spread of message not only to Jews but also Gentiles
