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Jesus' Core Message:

The Rule of God

- This rule is based on earlier Jewish visions of God's rule
 - though it expands table fellowship to include others

 - sinners
- and is not as "fire and brimstone" as John the Baptist's message
- But it's also articulated against Rome's political theology
 - Abba ("father") counters pater patriae
 - · Soter (savior) used of Jesus counters emperor's title
 - Evangelion (gospel) was emperor's term for his announcements
 - Basilea tou theo (kingdom of God) counters kingdom of Rome
 - The Twelve apostles: judges for Israel

Jesus vs. Rome's King Delegates sent out

send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. ⁸ He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff, no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; ⁹ but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. ⁹⁴ He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. ²³ If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is no your feet as a testimony against them. ⁹⁵ So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. ²³ They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Jesus vs. Rome's King The King hears of it

²⁴ King Herod heard of it, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, "John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him." "8 But others said, "It is Elijah." And others said, "It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old." ²⁶ But when Herod heard of it, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised."

Jesus vs. Rome's King

We have plenty of archaeological and literary evidence that people of Jesus' time believed in forces that could be swayed or cajoled by wonder-workers and by more home-grown technologies.

A Greek Magical Papyrus, Translated (sort of)
